

Has – Have – Had

Has is used for a third person (noun or pronoun) to show possession.

Example:

He **has** new shoes.
She **has** a nice coat.
It **has** long nails.

Has or **Have** are also used as helping verbs in forming present perfect tense not as indicator of possession.

Example:

I **have** told her.
She **has** told me.
We **have** told you.

The past tense form of **Have** and **Has** is **Had**. It works for all nouns and pronouns to show possession in the past.

Example:

I **had** a nice car.
She **had** a blue skirt.
We **had** time for it.

Had is also used as a helping verb to form the past perfect tense.

Example:

I **had** seen her.
We **had** seen them.
He **had** read the letter.

Have and **Had** are also used to show actions such as eating, drinking.

Example:

I **have** breakfast.
We **had** dinner.
They **had** a good time.
